Opener

Questions

How do you define fairness in your own life? How does this compare to God's definition of fairness?

How can comparison of others impact the way we see ourselves thought God's eyes?

How can understanding God's grace change your perspective on your own life circumstances?

In what ways can you extend grace to others (try to think of someone specific), especially those who may not "deserve" it by worldly standards?

What steps can you take to become more grateful for God's work in your life, even in situations that seem unfair?

Scripture Discovery:

Have yourself, another group member, or all group members read the following Scripture out loud Ephesians 2:8-10 (NLT)

God saved you by his grace when you believed. And you can't take credit for this; it is a gift from God. Salvation is not a reward for the good things we have done, so none of us can boast about it. For we are God's masterpiece. He has created us anew in Christ Jesus, so we can do the good things he planned for us long ago.
